Happy New Year everyone! On behalf of the whole Broadway Lodge care team and community, I would like to wish you good health, happiness, and prosperity in 2024.

We are starting the year off strong with good news from our funder for music therapy. Thanks to the excellent work and storytelling skills of music therapist Julianne Ryu, the Music Heals Charitable Foundation has recognized again the

rich value of music therapy at the Lodge. As a result, they were able to do a strong pitch with their donors to secure **\$15,000.00** towards our music therapy program. This is significant because VCH does not fund music therapy and we rely on donations to ensure that the program hours are supported and continue to benefit the residents. Even with this significant donation, we will still lose a few hours of music therapy interventions for lack of funding – this is an area where donations are always greatly appreciated! Another great piece of news is that we have been granted **\$34,200.00** from Equipcare BC to fund more ceiling lift upgrades. This is very exciting for us as we are seeking to replace some older equipment which will further enhance safety and comfort for both residents and staff!

Results of the Senior's Advocate 2023 Survey

In the spring of this year a significant number of volunteers across the province participated in the survey of 28,000 seniors living in care and their loved ones. In fact, almost 11,000 residents and close to 8,000 loved ones responded to the survey. There were eight recommendations that came of the survey results collected (available at

https://www.seniorsadvocatebc.ca/). The question you may ask is how did Broadway Lodge fare in the survey?

The Lodge saw an increase of 20-40% in positive scores overall. But we also observed a couple areas to work on! So, for example, as part of our focus on quality improvement for 2024, we will be working on staff to resident relationships – ensuring residents feel comfortable engaging with staff to ensure their needs are heard and met. As well, access to outdoors and the community will be reviewed to ensure freedom of movement is

- Average age is 83 (53% are 85 years or older and 6% are younger than 65 years)
- 63% are female
- 25% are married
- Average length of stay is 824 days
- Median length of stay is 481 days
 32% are dependent in activities of daily
- living (ADL 5+) 63% have dementia (mild to severe)
- 63% have dementia (mild to severe)

Reah was the perfect candidate to receive the award which focuses on 'the remarkable power of giving people more than they expect' – this is what unreasonable hospitality is all about: going above and beyond what people expect. Reah does this in spades and we are very proud of her and all that she does.

Renovations Update

I'll say it again... we are in the homestretch!

We anticipate between January 8-15th for the arrival of the wallboard and handrail products. Once onsite the work will begin. It will take approximately one week per floor to cut, glue, and install the products. This is being done with a very thoughtful plan in place to ensure safety and success with ease and comfort for all.

February will be the final major stage of the project with the flooring being installed. This work will be done in the evening and through the night to reduce risks to residents and maximize safety.

The very last step for the project is the room doors. We are looking to where we will fund this project from and what the final appearance of the doors will be – will it be decals (like the spa doors) or simply stripped and sanded with a gloss finish. This decision will be based on cost in the end. Stay tuned for an update on this last and final step!

We left 2023 strong with a vision for an even brighter new year—and so we enter 2024 with optimism and a renewed commitment to care for your loved ones.
